MEMBERS' INTERESTS - UPDATE

The listing of members' interests is normally updated every two years and a new edition will be due during 2004. Enclosed with this copy of the newsletter is a form to use if you have not previously submitted a list or if you wish to revise your entry. If you do not require any changes then ignore the form and your previous data will be transferred to the new edition.

Considerable thought has been given on how to publish the data. In the 21st century, the use of a microfiche reader can no longer be considered acceptable - very few people possess suitable readers and the ability to access readers is likely to become increasingly rare. Unfortunately all the alternatives - floppy disc, CDs and the Internet - equally suffer from lack of universal access.

Publishing the data on our web site would certainly be the cheapest option. Most members will either have access or be able fairly readily to access it through public Internet systems available in public libraries. It would, of course, not be acceptable to publish members names and addresses on the Internet.

What we propose is to put on to our web site the Introduction, Chapman County Codes and Members' Interests including the membership number of the member submitting the search name just as we currently publish in each Newsletter. To follow up on an entry, it will be necessary for the member to request from the Membership Secretary the name and address
